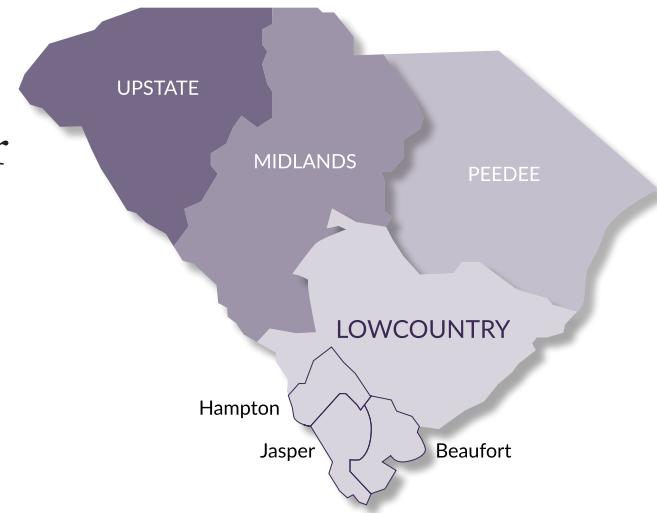

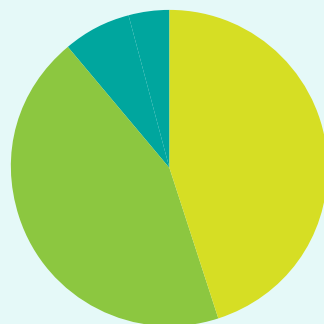

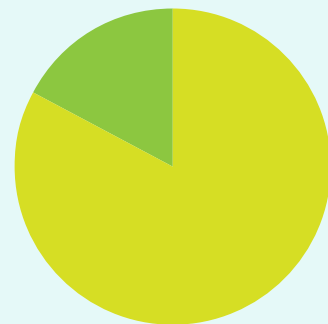

CASE MIX



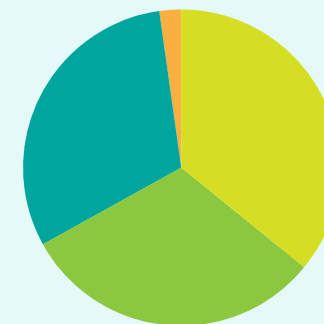

GENDER



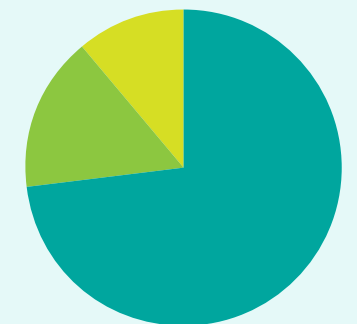

# Family Law

Standing beside families in crisis is embedded in our mission. Helping our clients find hope when things often look dark or ominous is embedded in our staff and volunteer's commitment to helping parents and children find stability, security, and hope through free civil legal services in Beaufort, Jasper, and Hampton counties.

Our Family Law Program changes lives every day—protecting survivors of domestic violence by obtaining Orders of Protection, helping parents secure custody and visitation, and ensuring children receive the financial support they deserve. Last year alone, we helped obtain more than \$170,000 in child support for Lowcountry children, providing families with critical resources for housing, food, healthcare, and education.

Through the dedication of volunteer attorneys, community partners, and staff, we are doing more than resolving legal issues. We are creating stability, financial security, and safety for local children and families across the Lowcountry.

Through her perseverance and the advocacy of the Lowcountry Legal Volunteers legal team, restraining orders were obtained to protect both Aife and her son, along with a divorce, full custody, and child support. These outcomes represent far more than legal victories. They reflect the courage of a mother who fought tirelessly to protect her child and create a safer, more stable future.

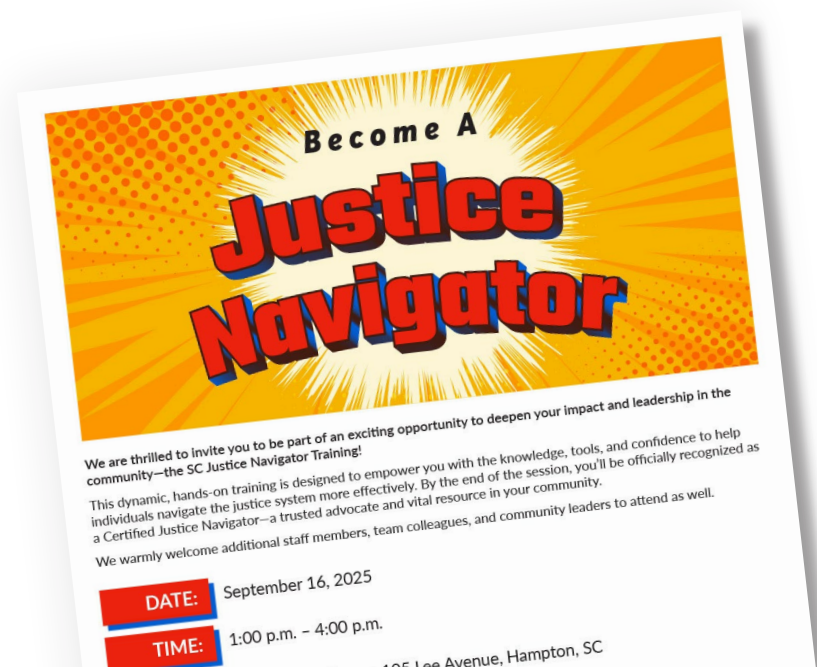

# Justice Navigator Initiative Strengthens Legal Empowerment Across the Southeast Crescent Region

Lowcountry Legal Volunteers (LLV) continues to strengthen community legal empowerment across the Southeast Crescent region through its Justice Navigator initiative, a community-centered effort focused on protecting family land, preserving cultural legacy, and expanding access to justice. By training 123 Justice Navigators across Beaufort, Jasper, and Hampton counties, LLV has helped build a trusted network of local leaders equipped to assist residents with issues related to heirs' property, probate, inheritance, housing stability, and family protection. These navigators serve as trusted community connectors, helping families recognize legal concerns early and access appropriate resources before problems escalate into crises.

The impact of this work was further affirmed through LLV's participation in Legal Link's four-state evaluation of Legal First Aid, conducted in partnership with Michigan Legal Help, the Oklahoma Access to Justice Foundation, and community partners in California. The five-hour Legal First Aid training was designed to help nonlawyer advocates identify civil legal issues, understand their role in community-based legal support, and connect individuals to appropriate legal resources. The evaluation demonstrated significant increases in legal knowledge and confidence among participants, with legal capability scores increasing from 54 to 76 on a 100-point scale and 91% of participants reporting measurable improvement. Participant satisfaction was exceptionally high, and the program achieved a Net Promoter Score of 79—considered “world class” and significantly above the legal sector standard.

Last year we trained 123 Justice Navigators across three counties.



These findings reinforce that Legal First Aid is a powerful and scalable strategy for strengthening community responses to civil legal challenges and improving outcomes for underserved populations most impacted by poverty, land loss, and systemic inequities.

In addition to training and evaluation efforts, LLV hosted Coffee Plus Connection focus groups that created welcoming spaces for community dialogue around land ownership, heirs' property, inheritance, probate, and generational wealth preservation. These gatherings brought together residents, Justice Navigators, attorneys, researchers, and community leaders to share concerns, ask questions, and discuss solutions grounded in local experiences and cultural understanding. The conversations reinforced the importance of trusted relationships and community-based education in helping families protect homes, land, and family assets for future generations. Rev. Dr. Arlene Dunbar, Community Ambassador for Hampton County, reflected on the impact of the initiative by sharing, “When people understand their rights and know where to turn for help, they begin to see that preserving family land and legacy is possible. The Justice Navigator program is giving our communities hope, knowledge, and the confidence to protect what generations worked so hard to build.”

Feedback and insights gathered through these sessions directly shaped future outreach and programming, including the development of a community education and resource event in Hampton County focused on probate, guardianship, inheritance, and protecting family land. Together, these partnerships and programs reflect a growing regional movement dedicated to preserving family assets, strengthening community resilience, and creating pathways toward long-term economic stability throughout the Southeast Crescent region.

# Medical-Legal Partnership

At Lowcountry Legal Volunteers, we understand that legal problems and health challenges are often deeply connected. Families struggling with unsafe housing, domestic violence, denial of benefits, financial instability, or caregiving responsibilities frequently experience serious impacts on their physical and emotional well-being. Through our Medical-Legal Partnership (MLP), LLV works hand-in-hand with healthcare providers and community partners to address the legal barriers that affect the health, safety, and stability of vulnerable individuals and families across the Lowcountry.

During 2025, LLV's Medical-Legal Partnership continued to grow significantly across Beaufort, Jasper, and Hampton counties, helping individuals and families navigate complex legal and medical challenges with compassion and dignity. Through partnerships with Bluffton Jasper Volunteers in Medicine, Good Neighbor Clinic, Hilton Head Island Volunteers in Medicine, Beaufort Jasper Hampton Comprehensive Health Services, and other healthcare providers, the MLP created a positive community impact reaching hundreds of individuals throughout the region.

The majority of MLP clients were low-income individuals and families living below 200% of the federal poverty level, with many identifying as single parents or caregivers facing extraordinary challenges while trying to care for themselves and their loved ones. Many clients represented underserved and rural communities throughout the Lowcountry, underscoring the importance of culturally responsive and bilingual legal services throughout our service area.

The Medical-Legal Partnership addressed a broad range of civil legal issues impacting health and stability, including family law matters, landlord/tenant disputes, wills, Healthcare Powers of Attorney, guardianships, disability-related matters, and access to public benefits and healthcare resources. By providing multiple legal services under one roof, LLV helped clients address urgent legal needs before those issues escalated into larger medical or financial crises.

A key strength of the MLP is accessibility and leadership. In 2025, Hannah Kidd, Esq. was named LLV's Medical-Legal Partnership Director, continuing her work providing direct representation, overseeing program operations, and coordinating outreach clinics and educational initiatives throughout the Lowcountry. Ivette Foreit joined LLV as the program's bilingual Medical-Legal Partnership paralegal, helping Spanish-speaking clients access legal services in a safe, welcoming, and trusted environment. Through regular bilingual office hours at partnering clinics, LLV expanded access to justice for individuals who might otherwise face significant barriers to receiving legal help.

One of the most exciting developments of 2025 was LLV's growing partnership with Beaufort Jasper Hampton Comprehensive Health Services, expanding access to legal support for patients in rural and underserved communities, particularly in Hampton County. Through regular outreach, office hours, and collaborative planning with healthcare providers and administrators, LLV strengthened its ability to connect patients with critical civil legal services as part of a holistic healthcare approach.

LLV also strengthened its infrastructure and data tracking capabilities through the support of volunteers and community partners, including collaboration with Clio case management consultant Dawn Douthat of 1=3 Consulting. In addition, LLV implemented pre- and post-wellness surveys using the 100 Million Lives Well Being Assessment model to better understand and measure the long-term impact legal services have on physical and mental health outcomes.

In 2025, LLV expanded partnerships and consultation efforts throughout South Carolina to strengthen the future of the Medical-Legal Partnership. Executive Director Anne Caywood and MLP Director Hannah Kidd traveled to Greenville to collaborate with leaders from the Upstate Medical-Legal Partnership, including South Carolina Legal Services, Furman University, and Prisma Health. These relationships have helped LLV strengthen outreach strategies, expand subject matter support, and develop long-term plans for sustainability, training, and statewide collaboration.

One of the most impactful initiatives connected to the MLP this year was LLV's growing Justice Navigator Program in partnership with Georgetown Law and Legal Link. Through this initiative, LLV trained community members, healthcare workers, and local leaders to identify civil legal issues and help individuals navigate the legal system and connect with resources. These trusted navigators have become an important bridge between underserved residents and the legal support they need.

The Medical-Legal Partnership also continued hosting Healthcare Power of Attorney clinics, informational fairs, "Know Your Rights" sessions, and outreach events throughout the community. These efforts not only increased awareness of legal resources but also helped patients and families feel supported, informed, and empowered during difficult moments in their lives.

At the heart of the Medical-Legal Partnership is the belief that healthcare and justice should work together. When families are protected from unsafe living conditions, survivors are safe from violence, parents can access child support, and individuals can secure healthcare protections and stability, health outcomes improve and communities become stronger.

Every client served through the MLP represents more than a legal case—they represent a family seeking hope, stability, and the opportunity to build a healthier future.

# A Mother's Peace of Mind

For one Lowcountry mother, caring for her son has never simply been a responsibility—it has been the center of her life.

From doctor's appointments and therapies to sleepless nights and daily routines, she has spent years making sure her son, who has special needs, was safe, loved, and cared for. Every decision she made and every sacrifice she carried was rooted in one thing: protecting her child.

But when her son turned eighteen, everything changed overnight.

Legally, she no longer had the authority to make important medical and personal decisions for him, despite being the person who had cared for him every single day of his life. Suddenly, the mother who knew her son best found herself terrified that she might not be able to continue protecting him when he needed her most.

When she came to Lowcountry Legal Volunteers, she was overwhelmed with fear and uncertainty about the future. More than anything, she worried about what would happen to her son if something happened to her.

Our attorneys, staff, and volunteers walked beside her through every step of the guardianship process. Together, we prepared the necessary court filings, guided her through complicated legal procedures, and reassured her that she would not have to face this journey alone.

When the court granted guardianship, it meant far more than a legal victory.

It meant that a mother could continue speaking for the child who depends on her voice.

It meant security, protection, and stability for a vulnerable young man whose mother has spent her life fighting for his well-being.

And as we continued working together, she shared another deeply personal fear—the fear every parent carries quietly in their heart: “Who will care for my child when I no longer can?”



To help provide peace of mind for the future, Lowcountry Legal Volunteers also assisted her in preparing a will and life-planning documents to ensure her son would continue to be protected, supported, and cared for no matter what tomorrow may bring.

By the end of the process, the relief on her face was impossible to miss. For the first time in a long time, she could breathe easier knowing her son's future was more secure.

Stories like this remind us that legal services are never just about paperwork or courtrooms. They are about love. They are about dignity. They are about helping families carry burdens they should never have to carry alone.

At Lowcountry Legal Volunteers, we stand beside families during some of the most emotional and uncertain moments of their lives—helping parents protect their children, helping seniors preserve their legacies, and helping vulnerable individuals find stability, hope, and peace of mind.

Because every parent deserves the comfort of knowing their child will be protected.

And every family deserves hope for the future.

# Life Planning & Wills/Heirs' Property

At Lowcountry Legal Volunteers, we believe that every family deserves the opportunity to protect what they have worked so hard to build. Through our Life Planning Program, LLV helps individuals and families prepare for the future with dignity, security, and peace of mind—ensuring loved ones are protected and family legacies are preserved for generations to come.

For many low-income families across the Lowcountry, legal documents such as wills, Healthcare Powers of Attorney, Durable Powers of Attorney, and advance directives are often financially out of reach or delayed until a crisis occurs. Without these protections in place, families can face painful legal disputes, instability, and the unintended loss of family homes and land. Through free legal services, education, and community clinics, LLV works to remove those barriers and make life planning accessible to everyone, regardless of income or circumstance.

In 2025, LLV expanded its wills and estate planning services throughout Beaufort, Jasper, and Hampton counties, helping families secure critical legal protections while preserving generational wealth and family stability. Through outreach clinics and partnerships with community organizations, medical providers, the Beaufort County Department of Veterans Affairs, and local advocates, LLV provided free assistance with wills, Healthcare Powers of Attorney, advance directives, and probate-related matters to vulnerable residents across the Lowcountry.

A growing area of focus for LLV has been heirs' property education and preservation. Heirs' property often occurs when land is passed down informally through generations without clear title or estate planning, leaving families vulnerable to legal disputes, forced sales, and the devastating loss of family land that may have been held for generations. This issue disproportionately impacts underserved and historically marginalized communities throughout South Carolina and the Lowcountry, where family land often represents not only financial security, but also cultural heritage, identity, and generational legacy.



Through partnerships with organizations, including the Center for Heirs' Property Preservation, the Lowcountry Gullah Foundation, veterans' organizations, and community leaders, LLV expanded outreach and education efforts focused on preventing the loss of family land and emphasizing the importance of estate planning and clear title protection. LLV also partnered with Cherese Handy, Contact Attorney and owner of The Heritage Law Firm, whose leadership and dedication have helped strengthen education and advocacy surrounding heirs' property and generational wealth preservation throughout the Lowcountry. These collaborative efforts are critical to helping families preserve generational assets, protect inherited property, and ensure land remains within families for future generations.

LLV also continued hosting wills and Healthcare Power of Attorney clinics throughout the region, ensuring seniors, veterans, caregivers, and medically vulnerable individuals could access essential legal planning services in a welcoming and supportive environment. By helping families plan ahead before a crisis occurs, LLV empowers clients to make decisions about their healthcare, finances, property, and loved ones with confidence and clarity.

At its heart, life planning is about more than legal documents—it is about protecting families, honoring legacies, and preserving the homes, land, and futures that families have worked generations to build. Through compassionate legal advocacy and community partnership, Lowcountry Legal Volunteers continues helping Lowcountry families secure peace of mind and protect what matters most.

# Safety First

At Lowcountry Legal Volunteers, we believe everyone deserves to feel safe in their own home and protected in their community. Yet for far too many individuals and families across South Carolina, domestic violence remains a heartbreaking and daily reality.

South Carolina continues to rank among the most dangerous states in the nation for domestic violence-related fatalities, and thousands of survivors seek protection from abuse every year. Here in the Lowcountry, survivors often face additional barriers to safety, including financial instability, housing insecurity, transportation challenges, and limited access to legal representation.

In 2025, Lowcountry Legal Volunteers continued expanding its Protecting Families Program to provide critical legal protection, advocacy, and hope to survivors of domestic violence across Beaufort, Jasper, and Hampton counties. As a proud partner housed within the Fourteenth Circuit Solicitor's Office and a member of Solicitor Duffie Stone's Victim Services Center, LLV strengthened access to protective orders and emergency legal services for survivors in crisis.

The Protecting Families Program mobilizes the legal community through attorney training and engagement, expands emergency legal services through pro bono and low bono representation, strengthens referral systems and partnerships, and empowers survivors to break free from cycles of abuse with the legal advocacy they deserve.



Through our attorneys, staff, and volunteer advocates, survivors receive assistance securing restraining orders, emergency protective orders, custody arrangements, divorce proceedings, and other essential legal protections designed to keep families safe. For many survivors, navigating the legal system can feel overwhelming and isolating during moments of crisis. Our team works closely with clients to ensure they understand their rights, prepare for hearings, and move through the legal process with dignity, compassion, and support.

In addition to direct representation, LLV continues strengthening partnerships with South Carolina Legal Services, the South Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault (SCCADVASA), community organizations, and volunteer attorneys to ensure survivors across the region can access life-changing legal help regardless of their financial circumstances.

Every restraining order secured, every child protected, and every survivor empowered reflects our commitment to putting safety first and building safer futures for families throughout the Lowcountry.

Mary's\* Journey

# A New Beginning

Last year, Mary\*, a patient at one of our partnering medical clinics, came to Lowcountry Legal Volunteers carrying an overwhelming burden. The father of her child had not only refused to provide financial support but had also subjected her to ongoing verbal and physical abuse. As the situation escalated, he began threatening to take their daughter and disappear—leaving Mary living in constant fear for both her safety and the safety of her child.

When Mary first met with our team, the emotional and physical toll of the abuse was undeniable. She shared that the stress and uncertainty had begun affecting her health, leaving her exhausted, anxious, and struggling simply to make it through each day. Like so many survivors, she felt trapped between fear and the desperate hope of creating a safer life for her daughter.

Lowcountry Legal Volunteers' attorneys, paralegals, and volunteers immediately went to work, standing beside Mary throughout every step of the legal process. Together, we fought to ensure she and her daughter would finally have the protection and stability they deserved.

Then, just one week before Christmas, Mary received life-changing news. The court issued a Final Order granting custody and child support, along with a restraining order protecting her from her abuser. The defendant was prohibited from taking the child without Mary's express permission and ordered to begin providing financial support for his daughter.

When the judge delivered the final ruling, our Medical-Legal Partnership Director, Hannah Kidd, watched as Mary let out a deep breath she had likely been holding for far too long. In that moment, the fear, uncertainty, and exhaustion that had weighed so heavily on her finally gave way to relief, safety, and hope.

Because of the services provided by Lowcountry Legal Volunteers, Mary and her daughter were able to begin the New Year not in fear, but with peace, security, and the promise of a brighter future. Cases like Mary's remind us that legal advocacy can do more than change the outcome of a case—it can restore dignity, protect health, reunite families with hope, and empower survivors to reclaim their lives.

# Community Outreach

At Lowcountry Legal Volunteers, community outreach is about far more than legal information—it is about building trust, restoring hope, and making sure our neighbors know they are not alone during some of life’s most difficult moments. Across the Lowcountry, too many individuals and families face legal challenges without knowing where to turn or believing help is possible. LLV is committed to meeting people where they are with compassion, dignity, and support.

In 2025, LLV expanded its outreach efforts throughout Beaufort, Jasper, and Hampton counties by partnering with local nonprofits, schools, faith communities, victim service organizations, senior centers, the court system and government agencies to connect vulnerable residents with critical legal resources and support services. Whether through legal clinics, educational workshops, courthouse advocacy, or community events, our team worked to bring access to justice directly into the communities we serve.

During the year, LLV conducted more than 65 community legal clinics and outreach events, serving over 1,000 attendees across the Lowcountry. These events provided residents with access to legal education, referrals, and direct assistance on issues, including family law, domestic violence protection, housing concerns, probate services, and other civil legal matters impacting vulnerable families and individuals.

One of the most impactful outreach initiatives of the year was the expansion of LLV’s Justice Navigator Training Program in partnership with Georgetown Law and Legal Link. Through this innovative initiative, LLV trained more than 100 Justice Navigators across our service area—empowering trusted community members with the knowledge and tools needed to help others better understand the legal system, access resources, complete forms, and connect with legal assistance.

For many residents, especially those in rural and underserved communities, Justice Navigators have become a critical bridge between individuals in crisis and the help they need. By equipping neighbors to help neighbors, LLV is building stronger, more connected communities where access to justice does not depend on income, geography, or circumstance.



LLV also continued strengthening partnerships within the Fourteenth Circuit Solicitor’s Office, South Carolina Legal Services, the South Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault, and numerous local organizations to improve referral networks and ensure survivors, seniors, families, and low-income residents could access life-changing legal support when they needed it most.

At the heart of every outreach effort is a simple belief: everyone deserves to be heard, supported, and treated with dignity.
